Volunteer Application

The Durham Rape Crisis Centre, otherwise known as DRCC, is a not-for-profit, charitable organization. We provide many services for survivors of sexual violence within the community of Durham Region. Our counselling services are all FREE and confidential. These services include a 24-hour crisis/support line, with select hours for chat service, supportive counselling and groups for women who are survivors of sexual violence, both historic and recent, advocacy and accompaniments to court and when reporting to police, promoting the concerns of GBV in public and political forums, public education workshops, fundraising events, and community development initiatives.

The DRCC volunteer training programs will provide you as a volunteer with valuable information, experience in a variety of areas including working with survivors of sexual violence on our 24-hour crisis/support line, as well as an opportunity to gain knowledge and experience in fundraising, non-profit writing, event planning and much more.

DRCC Mission Statement

The Durham Rape Crisis Centre is a feminist organization that believes in the equality of all people regardless of race, class, sexual orientation or gender. We are committed to taking an active role in our community to end all forms of violence against women and children. As a Rape Crisis Centre/Sexual Assault Centre we work with and provide support services to recent as well as historical or childhood survivors of sexual assault, sexual harassment, and childhood sexual abuse and their families.

DRCC Herstory

The Durham Rape Crisis Centre was established in 1974 by a group of women who recognized the need for support, counselling, and education in the area of Sexual Violence. At that time the existing services did not adequately meet the needs of those who had been assaulted. Initially the Centre was run and funded by a group of women who volunteered their time. They believed so strongly in the power of sharing one's experiences that they used their own baby bonus money to support a crisis line that to this day continues to support the community of Durham Region.

Since 1974, the Centre has been providing services to thousands of individuals within the Durham Region. In 1979, the Durham Rape Crisis Centre was moved to the Oshawa area. In 1990 the Ministry of the Attorney General became our core funding source. Due to this core funding, the Centre was able to respond to the needs of women 16 years of age and older who were affected by Sexual Violence.

We are presently an incorporated, non-profit, registered charitable Rape Crisis Centre. We are a member of the Ontario Coalition of Rape Crisis Centres and thus, receive support and education from across the province of Ontario.

Intake Interview

Once you have completed and submitted the application within this document as well as your resume, you will be contacted to set up a date/time for your volunteer intake interview. This typically takes less than 1 hour and is hosted over zoom/remotely.

DRCC Volunteer Training Programs

Once you have completed the volunteer intake interview the next step is to be invited to the appropriate training program. (It is possible to defer to a future session depending on your availability). The Crisis Line volunteers training program is typically offered 3 times throughout the year and is a required part of the volunteer intake process. It consists of 6 weekly module sessions (typically on a weeknight from 6pm – 9pm). After training is completed a brief final interview/self-assessment is conducted remotely to ensure that volunteers are ready to begin their volunteer efforts.

All volunteers must commit to the completion of the applicable DRCC Volunteer Training Program or Workshop for their volunteering role.

Volunteers

Volunteers are invaluable to the DRCC and have been the backbone of our organization since its inception in 1974. We recognize that our volunteers want to contribute to our cause and feel that their work is appreciated. Volunteering is an empowering and individual decision. It is a choice that includes giving your time, effort, and skills to support a cause that you believe in. Through volunteering with the DRCC you will be contributing to your community by aiding those who are in need and advocating for greater community awareness around sexual violence and Gender-Based Violence issues. You will gain new skills, work experience, and build self-confidence. Your contribution to the DRCC will benefit you, your community, and the individuals you're supporting. As a volunteer you will be continuing the efforts of a legacy of volunteers before you who have provided services through the DRCC 24/7 crisis and support line, as a Director on our Board, or as a special events volunteer.

For Crisis Line Volunteers we expect them to make a one-year commitment and schedule a minimum of 24 hours or 8 shifts per month. Each front-line shift is 3 hours each and conducted remotely.

Volunteers are welcome to book shifts consecutively (ex. volunteer for 6 hours at a time). The DRCC crisis line is staffed by volunteers who are women and non-binary/gender fluid individuals. Like roles within our counseling team, this is considered a bona fide job requirement and is therefore an exception under Subsection 24(1)(a) of the Code. More information can be found on the Ontario Human Rights Commission website.

Board of Directors

The Board of Directors are vitally important to the success, leadership and direction of DRCC. We are looking for candidates who understand the importance of the work we do and service we provide to the community; candidates who are open to innovation and progress, who have local knowledge, and skills in law, business, growth and development. Board members are elected for a 3 year term, with a maximum of 3 consecutive terms. There is an expectation that: board members are present for monthly board meetings, they attend the Annual General Meeting, all signature fundraising events (typically 2 a year), and other opportunities as they arise.

- If you have been a client with the DRCC, you must have finished counseling services for at least 1 year before you are eligible to volunteer for the crisis line.
